

CURRICULUM RESEARCH
(Curriculum Study and Improvement)

The District will work continuously toward curriculum improvement, constantly seeking the most appropriate materials available, employing a variety of techniques and synthesizing ideas and experiences from whatever sources are available. Curriculum improvement demands creative, well-informed teachers as well as supervisors and administrators.

Ideas, innovations, and creativity are to be encouraged at all levels. The literature, teachers, administrators or other schools, citizenry and study groups (local or regional) are all possible sources of ideas.

All innovations and experimental programs are to be thoroughly evaluated.

The improvement of the instructional program is a responsibility of individual teachers, as well as supervisory personnel and administrators. Suggestions for improvements shall be routed through proper channels to the Administrative Assistant (Curriculum and Instruction).

Curriculum study committees shall be formed at the direction of the Superintendent and Administrative Assistant (Curriculum and Instruction). They shall be representative of building staff, grade levels and/or subject area. The curriculum committees study major questions and/or problems concerning the curriculum and instructional programs to make recommendations to the administration.
