

PUBLIC CONDUCT AND ATTENDANCE ON SCHOOL PROPERTY

All persons on school grounds will be expected to abide by applicable laws, local ordinances, Board policies and building regulations.

No person on school property will assault, strike, threaten, menace or use improper, indecent, or obscene language toward a teacher, instructor, other employees or officials of the school, or students.

No person will disrupt, disturb or interfere with the teaching of any class of students, meeting, or any other activity conducted in a school building or upon the campus or grounds.

By written notice to the individual(s) involved, the Superintendent or designee is authorized to prohibit or limit any person(s) from being on school grounds or in attendance at school-sponsored events if in the opinion of the Superintendent or designee, the presence of that person(s) will cause a disruption to the educational process, school-sponsored event or the operation of a school building, or will pose a threat to the safety of any student, any school employee or official, or any visitor to school grounds. Any person prohibited or limited from school grounds by the Superintendent or designee may appeal to the Board of Education. The Board may reverse, affirm, or modify the order of the Superintendent or designee. The person shall comply with the order of the Superintendent or designee during the pendency of any appeal to the Board of Education.

Whoever violates the above policy and building regulations will be asked to leave the property by whoever is in charge. Should that person refuse, the police will be called. If the offender should be a student, the person in charge should report the student to the appropriate principal. The District will cooperate in any prosecution pursuant to the criminal laws of the State of Ohio and local ordinances.
