

SUPPLEMENTARY MATERIALS SELECTION AND ADOPTION

Supplemental instructional resources includes such items as books, book sets or collections, reading lists, dramatic productions, learning activities, visual media, videos and other materials that originate with the teacher and are not part of the adopted textbook process or the library media collections. Supplemental instructional resources may be those resources which are rented or borrowed from outside the District.

Supplemental resources must support the adopted curriculum. Selection of supplemental resources by certified staff shall be made using standard and professional acceptable criteria in accordance with regulations issued by the Superintendent.

The Board directs the Superintendent to issue regulations for the implementation of this policy.
