- F. Recommend approval of the amendment to the Community Reinvestment Area (CRA) Agreement with The Fischer Group contingent upon approval by Fairfield City Council on October 25, 2021. (This agreement was originally approved by the Board of Education on March 6, 2019. Due to the company revising their building plan, this amendment will lower the number of years of the abatement from eight (8) years to four (4) years and will lower the amount of the school compensation payment from \$13,000 per year to thirty (30) percent of the total value of the tax exemption. This amount will be determined each year based on the assessed valuation of the property.)
- G. Recommend that the Board of Education adopt the following resolution for declaring transportation to be impractical:

WHEREAS the student(s) identified below have been determined to be residents of this school district, and eligible for transportation services; and

WHEREAS after a careful evaluation of all available options, it has been determined that it is impractical to provide transportation for these student(s) to their selected school(s); and

WHEREAS the following factors as identified in Revised Code 3327.02 have been considered:

- 1. The time and distance required to provide the transportation
- 2. The number of pupils to be transported
- 3. The cost of providing transportation in terms of equipment, maintenance, personnel and administration
- 4. Whether similar or equivalent service is provided to other pupils eligible for transportation
- 5. Whether and to what extent the additional service unavoidably disrupts current transportation schedules
- 6. Whether other reimbursable types of transportation are available; and

WHEREAS the option of offering payment-in-lieu of transportation is provided in Ohio Revised Code: Therefore, be it

RESOLVED that the Fairfield City School District Board of Education hereby approves the declaration that it is impractical to transport the students identified herein and offers the parent(s)/guardian(s) of the following, payment-in-lieu of transportation.
