Mr. Engel's comments:

BOARD PRESIDENT PRIMES COMMUNITY FOR LEVIES\MISLEADS PUBLIC

I would like to address Mr. Morris' February 26 commentary. First of all, I was surprised to hear Morris, a university professor, admit that our American school system is doing a poor job of educating our children.

He also made two troubling, misleading statements.

Let me start with Mr. Morris' comment about <u>"anti-education rhetoric used against school</u> <u>levies in Ohio."</u> It's clear that he believes, and wants our community to believe, that anyone who votes "no" on school levies is anti-schools and anti-education. Such a prejudiced belief is laughable with no basis in fact.

Consider some facts that Mr. Morris conveniently forgot to tell us. First, the U.S. scores mid to below average on world-wide academic tests when compared to other industrialized nations. Yet, Mr. Morris fails to mention that the U.S. is already spending more on public education than almost every other nation in the world. I have a report that shows that the U.S. is the top spender out of 34 other nations. People like Mr. Morris always talk about the lack of funding. However, they never want to talk about how they are spending our taxes.

It's time for Mr. Morris to realize that the U.S. is already paying dearly for an excellent education for our children. Taxpayers are paying more for public education than almost every other nation in the world. The American people, including the citizens of Fairfield, are entitled to better results in the education of our children without dumping more money into the system. The truth is, there will never be enough money to satisfy our bloated, inefficient educational system. No matter how much we give them, they will always want more.

The fact is, contrary to what Mr. Morris and his pro-levy fanatic friends would have you believe, those of us who vote "no" on school levies are not anti-education. We are already paying more than almost everyone else in the world. The CARE name, Citizens for Accountability and Results in Education, says it all. The citizens voting NO are demanding accountability for better results in our educational system. Until we start holding our schools accountable for the job they are doing educating our children, we should expect the same dismal results. The money is there. The accountability is not.

If our school board really cared, then the accountability process would be started right here and right now. One way to start the accountability process is to assure every child who wants to go to college is prepared without the need for remediation. Sadly, 33% of our recent graduates went on to a state college unprepared. I have been trying to get the Fairfield BOE to address this serious problem since 2002. It was my number one educational issue when I was elected in 2005. Instead of addressing the problem, my fellow board members chose to sweep this failure under the rug. Therefore, the anti-education folks are NOT those of us voting NO and demanding accountability. Rather, it's the people who refuse to address our schools failures. The likes of Mr. Morris and Mr. Murray bear

much of the responsibility for the students who are ill-prepared for college-level work. Until they wake up and place accountability ahead of more money, I'm afraid the trend will continue

Mr. Morris made a second misleading statement following my comments refuting accusations of having a hidden agenda.

I said "Does Mr. Morris and Mr. Murray have a hidden agenda? You bet they do. It's an agenda to turn the Fairfield school district into an elitist community. Only those who can afford their taxes will be welcome. If you dare question their spending you will be attacked viciously. Their message to the low income citizens and struggling senior citizens of our community is pay or move. Does our board have a plan that includes them? If they do I have not seen it."

To that, Mr. Morris said <u>"I do not believe that challenging our community to be</u> <u>knowledgeable and engaged should be considered an elitist attitude."</u> This is just another mud slinging attack by Mr. Morris. He clearly does not want to focus on those in our community who can least afford additional taxes. I agree that it is beneficial to have a community that is knowledgeable on school issues and spending. However, being knowledgeable has nothing to do with being an elitist. In this case, I was using the term elitist to describe the pro-levy fanatics who apparently can afford endless tax increases. Time and time again, they have placed their interests ahead of the vulnerable citizens who are at their financial breaking point.

So, why all this discussion now? It's simple. The taxpayers in our district will soon be facing 3 costly levies. We will see a Permanent Improvement levy this year, and Operating and Bond levies in the very near future. Mr. Morris is priming the community in an effort to pass all of his levies. Apparently he does NOT care about: An impending deep recession, people losing their jobs, record Butler County foreclosures, \$4.00 gasoline prices, high property taxes, and declining home sales and prices. Well, I'm going on record as saying I DO CARE!

Mr. Kearns

Six Fairfield Middle School students have qualified for the state science fair. The students are: Nate Chester, Matthew Coates, Bernard Hogan, Mike Jones, LeeAnn Olthaus, and Nimisha Swali. They will be participating at Ohio State University on May 10.

The Board of Education made promises to our community when the 2003 Permanent Improvement levy was passed. At our March 6th work session, Mr. Engel asked what projects have not been completed. It was reported to us that the majority of the projects are completed and those remaining have a plan in place to be completed by the end of the year. I have to believe that there are others unaware of our accomplishments. I would like to recommend that we place inexpensive/temporary (similar to small yard sings) signs at each of our buildings that list what projects have been completed. It is imperative that we communicate how we have used their tax dollars to make our schools better.

I have completed tours of all of our buildings. I found these visits to be informative. In addition, these tours reaffirmed to be that we have something "excellent" going on in our district. It didn't hurt that my last tour included "Pie Day" at the Intermediate Building. Again, thank you to all of the staff and teachers for welcoming me into your buildings and classrooms. The innovation and accommodations that our teachers make for our students is impressive. We must remember teacher quality is crucial for our success. The information gleamed from these visits will be invaluable to me as a Board Member.

It was my pleasure and honor to attend the OSBA Southwest Region Spring Conference where Kim Nuxhall received the 2008 President's Award from the OSBA Southwest Region for his leadership and commitment to Character Education. I again want to congratulate Kim on his award.

Mr. Murray and I attended the Education/Curriculum Committee Meeting last evening. From time to time we will meet to discuss important issues as it relates to our curriculum and bring recommendations back to the full board as necessary. You will be hearing more from us over the next few meetings.
