10. Recommend approval of the Resolution of Necessity for the replacement of the twomill permanent improvement levy to be placed on the November 4, 2008 ballot

> RESOLUTION DECLARING THE NECESSITY OF LEVYING A REPLACEMENT TAX IN EXCESS OF THE TEN-MILL LIMITATION AND REQUESTING THE COUNTY AUDITOR TO CERTIFY MATTERS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH

WHEREAS, this board of education anticipates replacing a tax levy in excess of the ten-mill limitation as described herein;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 5705.03 of the Ohio Revised Code as amended by Am. Sub. S.B. No. 201 enacted by the 122nd General Assembly, this board of education is required to certify to the county auditor a resolution requesting the county auditor to certify certain matters in connection with such a tax levy;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Fairfield City School District:

SECTION 1. That pursuant to the provisions of Sections 5705.21 and 5705.192 of the Ohio Revised Code, it is necessary that a replacement tax be levied in excess of the ten-mill limitation for the purpose of permanent improvements, at a rate not exceeding two (2.00) mills for each one dollar (\$1.00) of valuation, which amounts to twenty cents (\$0.20) for each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of valuation, for a five (5) year period of time.

SECTION 2. That the question of the passage of said replacement tax levy shall be submitted to the electors of the school district at an election to be held on November 4, 2008. If approved by the electors, said tax levy shall first be placed upon the 2008 tax list and duplicate, for first collection in calendar year 2009.

SECTION 3. That pursuant to Section 5705.03 of the Ohio Revised Code, the county auditor is hereby requested to certify to this board of education the total current tax valuation of the school district and the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the number of mills specified in Section 1 hereof, and the treasurer of this board of education be and is hereby directed to certify forthwith a copy of this resolution to the

county auditor at the earliest possible time so that said county auditor may certify such matters in accordance with such Section 5705.03.

SECTION 4. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this board of education concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this board of education, and that all deliberations of this board of education, and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code, and the rules of this board of education adopted in accordance therewith.
